Our Parish Patron Saints

St. Ambrose

Bishop & Doctor of the Church

Feast Day - December 7th

Born to the Roman nobility. Educated in the classics, Greek, and philosophy at Rome, Italy. Poet & noted orator. Convert to Christianity. Governor of Milan, Italy.

When the bishop of Milan died, a dispute over his replacement led to violence. Ambrose intervened to calm both sides; he impressed everyone involved so much that though he was still an unbaptized catechumen, he was chosen as the new bishop. He resisted, claiming that he was not worthy, but to prevent further violence, he assented, and on the 7th of December 374. He was baptized, ordained as a priest, and consecrated as bishop. He immediately gave away his wealth to the Church and the poor, both for the good it did and as an example to his flock.

St. Matthew

Apostle and Evangelist

Feast Day - September 21st

Son of Alphaeus, he lived at Capernaum on Lake Genesareth. He was a Roman tax collector, a position equated with collaboration with the enemy by those from whom he collected taxes. Jesus' contemporaries were surprised to see the Christ with a traitor, but Jesus explained that he had come "not to call the just, but sinners." Matthew's Gospel is given pride of place in the canon of the New Testament, and was written to convince Jewish readers that their anticipated Messiah had come in the person of Jesus. He preached among the Jews for 15 years.

St. Sylvester

Pope

Feast Day - December 31st

Son of Rufinus. Pope in the reign of Emperor Constantine I. Built the Basilica of Saint John Lateran and other churches. Sent legates to the First Council of Nicaea, and was involved in the controversy over Arianism.

Patron Saint of animals & stone masons. Invoked for good harvests

Did You Know - Calvin Kulik

DID YOU KNOW... that Knights of Columbus CEO and former member of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, Carl Anderson, co-published an article for **Time** magazine on October 18, 2017? Anderson teamed up with Eugene F. Rivers, III, founder and president of the Seymour Institute for Black Church and Policy Studies, to write an article entitled “*MLK’s Example Holds the Answer to both Racism and Political Violence.*” In the article, the authors cited King’s 1957 essay “*Nonviolence and Racial Justice*” in which he stated:

At the center of nonviolence stands the principle of love. In struggling for human dignity, the oppressed people of the world must not allow themselves to become bitter or indulge in hate campaigns. To retaliate with hate and bitterness would do nothing but intensify the hate in the world. Along the way of life, someone must have sense enough and morality enough to cut off the chain of hate. This can be done only by projecting the ethics of love to the center of our lives.”

They emphasized that if King were alive today he would have condemned in the most explicit terms any form of violent political protest such as acts occurring today by groups like the neo-Nazis, white supremacists, antifa, and any other racist hate groups.
